

GENERAL PRACTICE NURSING STUDY PROGRAM STUDENTS' SURVEY ABOUT THE CONTENT OF THE SUBJECT AND TEACHING QUALITY

AUTUMN SEMESTER 2025-2026

DURATION: The study subjects taken in the autumn semester of 2025 – 2026 could be evaluated after receiving the final evaluation of the subject by 27 February 2026.

AIM: To reveal students' opinion about the content and quality of teaching of the study subject.

TARGET GROUP: all students of the General Practice Nursing study programme who have attended the study subjects and received evaluations in the autumn semester of 2025 – 2026.

OBJECT OF THE RESEARCH: all study subjects that were delivered in the autumn semester of 2025 – 2026 and have not yet been evaluated.

RESEARCH METHOD: questionnaire survey (quantitative and qualitative empirical data collected). The survey was conducted in the electronic space – the Study Management System. The data was processed using Microsoft Excel and SPSS programs. Participation in the survey was voluntary, the survey was confidential and anonymous. The students evaluated the quality of the content and teaching according to the formulated statements on a five-point scale (1 – I strongly disagree, 5 – I completely agree). Students of the General Practice Nursing study programme carried out the assessment of the quality of the subject content according to 6 criteria, the assessment of the quality of teaching according to 8 criteria, and a total of 14 criteria.

RESULTS: A total of 398 fully completed questionnaires were received in the Study Management System (Response rate 81.2 per cent). Summarizing the results obtained, it can be said that the quality of the content of the subjects of the General Practice Nursing study programme is evaluated very high according to all criteria (averages more than 4 points out of 5). Most respondents agree with the statements that the study objectives were defined (4.66) and that the theory is based on practical examples (4.61), the assessment tasks provided an opportunity to demonstrate the knowledge and skills acquired during the studies (4.61), the least respondents agree with the statement that self-study work was useful (4.57) (see Figure 1).

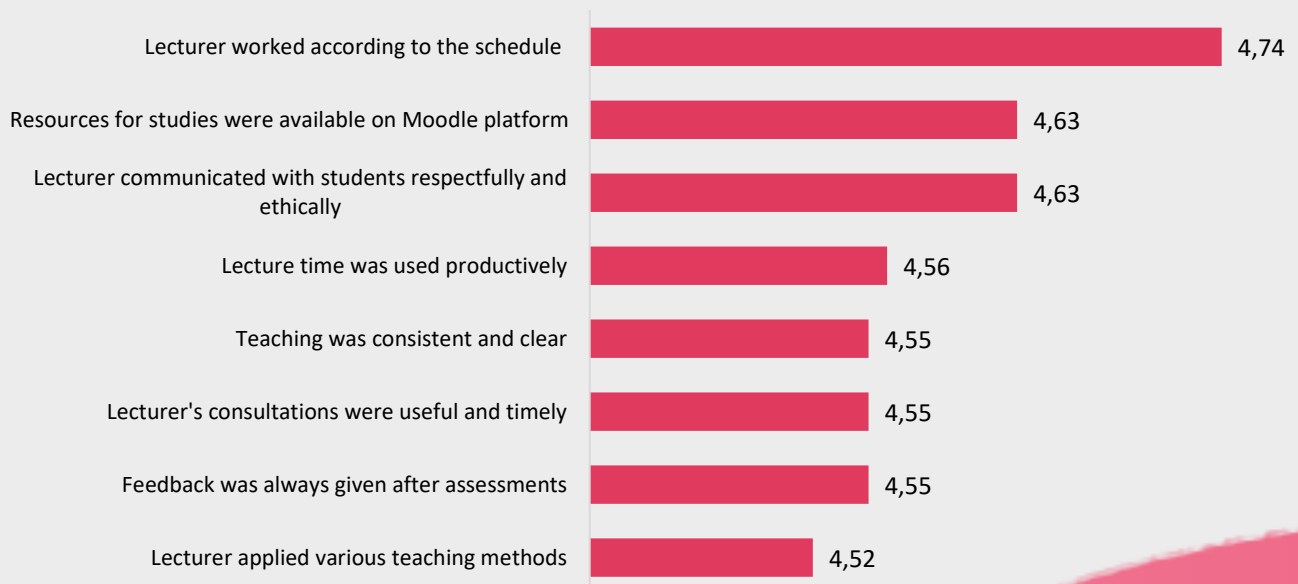


Figure 2. Assessment of the quality of teaching of General Practice Nursing study programmes according to criteria (averages).

The quality of teaching of the subjects of General Practice Nursing study programme is evaluated very high according to all criteria (averages more than 4 points out of 5) (see Figure 2). Respondents mostly agree with the statement that the lecturer worked according to the schedule (4.74), and the least agree with the statements that the lecturer applied various teaching methods (4.52). (see Figure 2).
